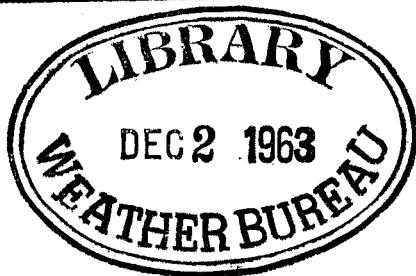
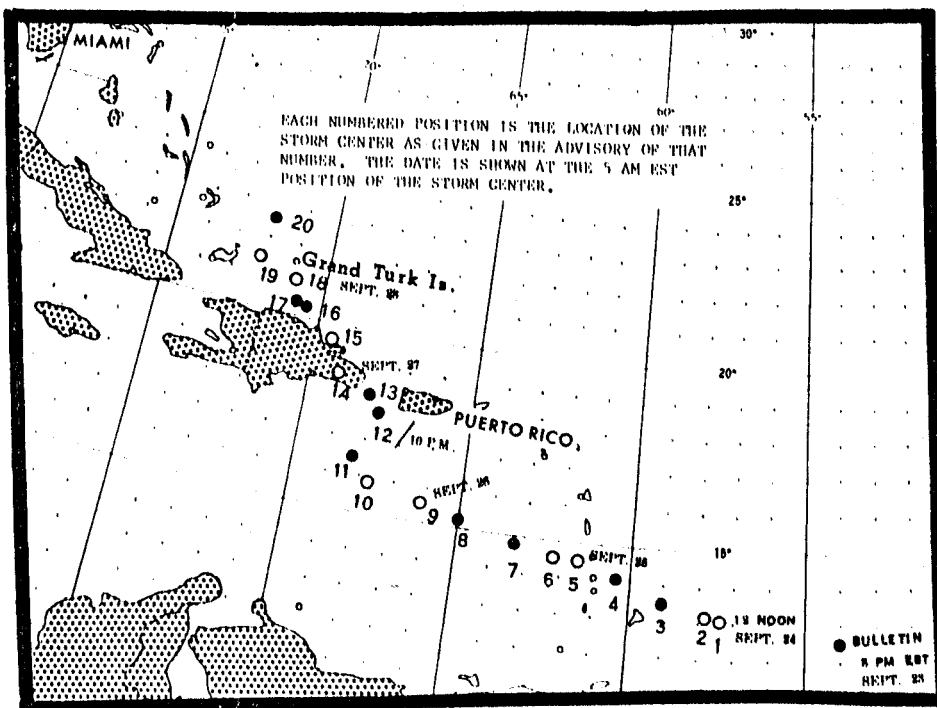

PRELIMINARY REPORT ON HURRICANE "EDITH", SEPTEMBER 23-28, 1963

Hurricane "Edith" formed in the southwestern North Atlantic on September 24, 1963, moved west northwestward through the Lesser Antilles, the northeastern Caribbean Sea, and eastern Haiti, and degenerated into a weakening tropical depression north of Hispaniola September 28.

Existence of a disturbance east of Barbados was first suspected when the Dutch tanker Acteon reported a south wind of 28 mph and surface pressure of 1010.1 millibars as it moved southward across the Intertropical Convergence Zone at 1800Z September 22. Photographs taken by TIROS VII at 1156 GCT September 23 showed a vortex with a circulation covering an extensive area located at 11N 52W. Reconnaissance aircraft reached the area by late afternoon and found winds of 29 mph and surface pressure 1005 millibars, but no definite radar pattern.

A bulletin was issued by the San Juan Weather Bureau at 9 PM AST September 23 indicating that a tropical depression has formed about 400 miles east of Barbados and that further intensification was expected.

An early morning reconnaissance flight on the 24th found winds of 70 mph and surface pressure 1004 millibars. The first advisory on "Edith" was issued by the San Juan Weather Bureau at 12 noon AST on the 24th indicating that the depression had reached tropical storm intensity and was located near 13.0N 57.3W. Later information from the reconnaissance aircraft showed that surface winds had increased to 80 mph with surface pressure 1000 millibars.

On the basis of this report, the San Juan Weather Bureau issued a special advisory at 2 PM AST on the 24th stating that "Edith" had reached hurricane intensity and was located about 120 miles east of Barbados moving toward the west northwest at 18 mph. Due to the hurricane's proximity to the Windward and Leeward Islands, hurricane warnings were issued in the special advisory for the area from Guadeloupe to St. Vincent and Barbados and gale warnings were issued northward from Guadeloupe to St. Maarten and southward from St. Vincent to Grenada. At 12 midnight AST September 25 a hurricane watch was made effective for Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.

Hurricane "Edith" continued moving west northwest. The center passed across the island of St. Lucia at 4 AM AST September 25. After entering the Caribbean, "Edith" intensified slightly with highest winds 100 mph, but showed little change for the next 24 hours. As "Edith" advanced across the eastern Caribbean the hurricane watch was extended to include Haiti and the Dominican Republic; whole gale warnings were issued for the south coast of Hispaniola west of Santo Domingo and gale warnings were issued for Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands and the Dominican Republic east of Santo Domingo.

The center of "Edith" passed about 175 miles south of St. Croix, Virgin Islands at 4 AM AST on the 26th and at 12 Noon the same day hurricane warnings were issued for southern Haiti and southwestern Dominican Republic.

A dampening high-level circulation moved over Hurricane "Edith" on the 26th. Reconnaissance aircraft during the afternoon had difficulty in locating the eye. During the evening the hurricane became more disorganized, slowed down and turned toward the north northwest. Hurricane warnings were raised for eastern Dominican Republic and extreme western Puerto Rico and discontinued for western Hispaniola in a special advisory issued by the San Juan Weather Bureau at 10 PM AST.

By midnight it was apparent that "Edith" had weakened and would move across the eastern portion of the Dominican Republic and hurricane warnings were changed to gale warnings for western Puerto Rico. The center of "Edith" entered the Dominican Republic just west of the city of La Romana at 4 AM AST September 27 and moved off the north coast of the Dominican Republic east of Puerto Plata shortly before noon. Highest winds reported as "Edith" moved over land was 63 mph from the southeast of La Romana.

No deaths were reported on St. Lucia; however, there were 10 deaths and 50 seriously injured on Martinique. Final fatality reports have not been received from other islands affected by "Edith's" passage through the Caribbean. In Martinique 6000 dwellings were destroyed and 13,000 others badly damaged. The banana crop was ruined and the sugar crop and other food crops heavily damaged. Property losses in other Caribbean areas affected appear to have been only moderate.

SAN JUAN WEATHER BUREAU FOR PRESS RADIO AND TV 9 PM AST SEPTEMBER 23 1963.

REPORTS FROM NAVY RECONNAISSANCE AIRCRAFT EARLY THIS EVENING SHOW THAT A TROPICAL DEPRESSION HAS FORMED IN THE ATLANTIC EAST OF THE WINDWARD ISLANDS.

AT 9 PM AST...0100Z...THE CENTER OF THE TROPICAL DEPRESSION WAS ESTIMATED NEAR LATITUDE 12.5 NORTH LONGITUDE 54.0 WEST OR ABOUT 400 STATUTE MILES EAST OF BARBADOS LESSER ANTILLES. POSITION IS FAIR DUE TO POOR ORGANIZATION OF THE DEPRESSION. THE TROPICAL DEPRESSION APPEARS TO BE MOVING WEST NORTHWEST AT ABOUT 15 MPH AND IS EXPECTED TO CONTINUE ON THIS COURSE AND AT THE SAME SPEED FOR THE NEXT 12 HOURS.

HIGHEST WINDS ARE ESTIMATED TO BE ABOUT 30 MPH IN SQUALLS IN THE NORTH AND EAST QUADRANTS. AT PRESENT THE TROPICAL DEPRESSION IS JUST A LARGE AREA OF SQUALLY WEATHER WITHOUT ORGANIZATION BUT CONDITIONS APPEAR FAVORABLE FOR SLOW INTENSIFICATION.

PEOPLE IN THE WINDWARD AND LEEWARD ISLANDS FROM GRENADA AND BARBADOS NORTHWARD SHOULD KEEP IN TOUCH WITH LATEST INFORMATION AND BE READY TO TAKE QUICK PRECAUTIONS SHOULD INTENSIFICATION OCCUR DURING THE NIGHT. RECONNAISSANCE AIRCRAFT WILL INVESTIGATE THE AREA OF THE DEPRESSION BEFORE DAYBREAK TUESDAY AND MORE DETAILED INFORMATION WILL BE AVAILABLE AT THAT TIME.

SMALL CRAFT IN THE WINDWARD AND LEEWARD ISLANDS SHOULD NOT VENTURE FAR FROM PORT.

BULLETINS WILL BE ISSUED BY THE SAN JUAN WEATHER BUREAU AS ADDITIONAL INFORMATION IS RECEIVED.

SAN JUAN WEATHER BUREAU TROPICAL STORM ADVISORY NUMBER 1 EDITH 12 NOON AST SEPTEMBER 24 1963.

HURRICANE WARNINGS ARE IN EFFECT IMMEDIATELY IN THE LEEWARD AND WINDWARD ISLANDS FROM GUADELOUPE TO ST VINCENT AND BARBADOS. GALE WARNINGS ARE IN EFFECT FROM GUADELOUPE NORTHWARD TO ST MAARTENS.

NAVY RECONNAISSANCE AIRCRAFT AND VESSEL REPORTS SHOW THAT THE TROPICAL DEPRESSION IN THE ATLANTIC EAST OF BARBADOS HAS INTENSIFIED AND IS NOW A TROPICAL STORM. THE RECONNAISSANCE AIRCRAFT LOCATED THE EYE AND AT 12 NOON AST...1600Z...IT WAS CENTERED NEAR LATITUDE 13.0 NORTH LONGITUDE 57.3 WEST OR ABOUT 180 STATUTE MILES EAST OF BARBADOS LESSER ANTILLES. TROPICAL STORM EDITH APPEARS TO BE MOVING BETWEEN WEST AND WEST NORTHWEST AT 15 MPH. THE TROPICAL STORM IS STILL POORLY ORGANIZED AND IT IS DIFFICULT TO DETERMINE FUTURE DIRECTION BUT A DIRECTION BETWEEN WEST AND WEST NORTHWEST AT ABOUT THE SAME SPEED CAN BE EXPECTED FOR THE NEXT 12 HOURS.

TROPICAL STORM EDITH IS FORECAST TO INCREASE IN SIZE AND REACH HURRICANE INTENSITY LATER TODAY AND PASS BETWEEN MARTINIQUE AND ST LUCIA BY WEDNESDAY NOON. HIGHEST WINDS ARE ESTIMATED TO BE 70 MPH OVER A SMALL AREA NEAR THE CENTER AND GALE WINDS EXTEND OUTWARD FROM THE CENTER 150 MILES IN THE NORTH AND EAST QUADRANTS AND 50 MILES IN OTHER QUADRANTS.

PEOPLE IN THE AREA OF THE HURRICANE WARNINGS SHOULD TAKE IMMEDIATE PRECAUTIONS AGAINST POSSIBLE HURRICANE FORCE WINDS HIGH TIDES AND SURF AND HEAVY RAINS. TIDES ALONG THE REEFS IN THE HURRICANE WARNING AREA WILL BE 4 TO 6 FEET ABOVE NORMAL. THE BARBADOS ST LUCIA MARTINIQUE DOMINICA AREA SHOULD RUSH PREPARATIONS AGAINST TROPICAL STORM EDITH AND KEEP IN TOUCH WITH LATEST INFORMATION.

SHIPPING IN THE PATH OF THE STORM SHOULD EXERCISE CAUTION AND SMALL CRAFT IN THE LESSER ANTILLES SHOULD SEEK SAFE HARBOR.

THE NEXT REGULAR ADVISORY ON TROPICAL STORM EDITH WILL BE ISSUED AT 6 PM AST 2200Z AND BULLETINS WILL BE ISSUED AT FREQUENT INTERVALS.

SAN JUAN SPECIAL WEATHER BUREAU HURRICANE ADVISORY NUMBER 2 EDITH 2 PM AST SEPTEMBER 24 1963.

HURRICANE WARNINGS ARE IN EFFECT FOR THE LEEWARD AND WINDWARD ISLANDS FROM GUADELOUPE TO ST VINCENT AND BARBADOS. GALE WARNINGS ARE IN EFFECT FROM GUADELOUPE NORTHWARD TO ST MAARTENS AND FROM ST VINCENT SOUTHWARD TO GRENADA.

LATEST RECONNAISSANCE REPORTS INDICATE THAT EDITH HAS REACHED HURRICANE INTENSITY AND ITS FORWARD SPEED HAS INCREASED. AT 2 PM AST...1800Z...HURRICANE EDITH WAS CENTERED NEAR LATITUDE 13.1 NORTH LONGITUDE 57.8 WEST OR ABOUT 120 STATUTE MILES EAST OF BARBADOS LESSER ANTILLES. IT IS MOVING BETWEEN WEST AND WEST NORTHWEST AT ABOUT 18 MPH AND IS EXPECTED TO CONTINUE IN ABOUT THE SAME DIRECTION AND AT THE SAME SPEED FOR THE NEXT 12 HOURS.

HURRICANE EDITH IS EXPECTED TO REACH THE VICINITY OF BARBADOS ABOUT 8 PM AST TONIGHT AND BE IN THE ST LUCIA MARTINIQUE AREA BY 3 AM AST WEDNESDAY. ALL PRECAUTIONS AGAINST HURRICANE FORCE WINDS HIGH TIDES AND SURF AND TORRENTIAL RAINS IN THE AREA FROM GUADELOUPE SOUTHWARD TO ST VINCENT AND BARBADOS SHOULD BE RUSHED TO COMPLETION BY SUNSET TODAY. WINDS WILL BEGIN TO INCREASE IN THE AREA OF DISPLAY THIS AFTERNOON AND REACH HURRICANE FORCE IN THE BARBADOS AREA BY NIGHTFALL. WINDS SHOULD INCREASE TO HURRICANE FORCE IN THE AREA FROM GUADELOUPE TO ST VINCENT BY MIDNIGHT TONIGHT. TIDES ALONG THE REEFS IN THE HURRICANE WARNING AREA WILL BE RISING THIS AFTERNOON AND BE 4 TO 6 FEET ABOVE NORMAL BY TONIGHT. ALL INTERESTS IN THE WINDWARD AND LEEWARD ISLANDS SHOULD KEEP IN TOUCH WITH LATEST ADVISORIES AND BULLETINS.

HIGHEST WINDS IN HURRICANE EDITH ARE ESTIMATED TO BE ABOUT 80 MPH IN A SMALL AREA NEAR THE CENTER. GALE FORCE WINDS EXTEND OUTWARD 175 MILES IN THE NORTH AND EAST QUADRANTS AND ABOUT 60 MILES IN THE SOUTH AND WEST. SOME FURTHER INCREASE IN SIZE AND INTENSITY IS EXPECTED DURING THE NEXT 12 HOURS.

SHIPPING IN THE PATH OF THE STORM SHOULD EXERCISE EXTREME CAUTION AND SMALL CRAFT IN THE LESSER ANTILLES SHOULD REMAIN IN PORT.

THE NEXT REGULAR ADVISORY ON HURRICANE EDITH WILL BE ISSUED BY THE SAN JUAN WEATHER BUREAU AT 6 PM AST 2200Z AND BULLETINS WILL BE ISSUED AT FREQUENT INTERVALS.

SAN JUAN WEATHER BUREAU BULLETIN FOR PRESS RADIO AND TV 4 PM AST SEPTEMBER 24 1963.

HURRICANE WARNINGS ARE IN EFFECT FOR THE AREA FROM GUADELOUPE TO ST VINCENT AND GALE WARNINGS ARE IN EFFECT NORTH OF GUADELOUPE TO ST MAARTENS AND SOUTH OF ST VINCENT TO GRENADA.

HURRICANE PRECAUTIONS SHOULD BE RUSHED TO COMPLETION THIS AFTERNOON IN THE HURRICANE WARNING AREA. WINDS ARE ALREADY INCREASING IN THE WINDWARD ISLANDS. EARLY THIS AFTERNOON BARBADOS REPORTED WIND GUSTS TO 50 MPH WITH HIGH SEAS BREAKING ON THE REEFS AND ST LUCIA HAD STEADY WINDS OF 32 MPH.

AT 4 PM AST...2000Z...HURRICANE EDITH ON THE BASIS OF SHIP AND RECONNAISSANCE REPORTS WAS ESTIMATED TO BE LOCATED NEAR LATITUDE 13.3 NORTH LONGITUDE 58.3 WEST OR ABOUT 90 STATUTE MILES EAST OF BARBADOS LESSER ANTILLES MOVING BETWEEN WEST AND WEST NORTHWEST AT ABOUT 18 MPH. THE HURRICANE IS EXPECTED TO CONTINUE MOVING IN THE SAME DIRECTION AND AT ABOUT THE SAME SPEED FOR THE NEXT 12 HOURS.

HIGHEST WINDS ARE 80 MPH NEAR THE CENTER AND GALE WINDS EXTEND 175 MILES TO THE NORTH AND EAST AND ABOUT 60 MILES TO THE SOUTH AND WEST OF THE CENTER. AN INCREASE IN SIZE AND INTENSITY IS EXPECTED DURING THE NEXT 12 HOURS.

SHIPS IN THE PATH OF THE STORM SHOULD EXERCISE CAUTION AND SMALL CRAFT IN THE LESSER ANTILLES SHOULD REMAIN IN SAFE SHELTER.

HURRICANE WARNINGS ARE IN EFFECT FOR THE LEEWARD AND WINDWARD ISLANDS FROM GUADELOUPE TO ST VINCENT AND BARBADOS. GALE WARNINGS ARE IN EFFECT FROM GUADELOUPE NORTHWARD TO ST MAARTEN AND FROM ST VINCENT SOUTHWARD TO GRENADA.

ALL PRECAUTIONS AGAINST HURRICANE FORCE WINDS HIGH TIDES HEAVY SURF AND TORRENTIAL RAINS SHOULD BE RUSHED TO COMPLETION AT MARTINIQUE ST LUCIA BARBADOS GUADELOUPE DOMINICA AND ST VINCENTS. BARBADOS HAS ALREADY REPORTED WINDS IN GUSTS TO 50 MPH AND HIGH SURF ON THE REEFS.

FROM VESSEL AND AIRCRAFT REPORTS THIS AFTERNOON HURRICANE EDITH WAS ESTIMATED TO BE CENTERED AT 6 PM AST...2200Z...NEAR LATITUDE 13.5 NORTH AND LONGITUDE 59.0 WEST OR ABOUT 60 STATUTE MILES EAST NORTHEAST OF BARBADOS AND 600 STATUTE MILES SOUTHEAST OF SAN JUAN PUERTO RICO. IT IS MOVING WEST NORTHWEST AT 18 MPH AND IS FORECAST TO CONTINUE IN ABOUT THE SAME DIRECTION AND AT THE SAME SPEED FOR THE NEXT 12 HOURS.

HIGHEST WINDS ARE ABOUT 80 MPH OVER A SMALL AREA NEAR THE CENTER AND GALE WINDS EXTEND OUTWARD FROM THE CENTER 200 MILES IN THE NORTH AND EAST QUADRANTS AND 75 MILES IN THE SOUTH QUADRANT. A SLIGHT INCREASE IN SIZE AND INTENSITY IS EXPECTED.

ON ITS PRESENT COURSE AND SPEED THE CENTER OF HURRICANE EDITH WILL PASS ABOUT 35 MILES TO THE NORTH OF BARBADOS ABOUT 8 OCLOCK TONIGHT AND BE IN THE VICINITY OF ST LUCIA ABOUT 3 OCLOCK AST WEDNESDAY MORNING.

SHIPPING IN THE PATH OF THIS HURRICANE SHOULD EXERCISE CAUTION AND SMALL CRAFT IN THE LESSER ANTILLES SHOULD REMAIN IN PORT.

THE NEXT REGULAR ADVISORY WILL BE ISSUED BY THE SAN JUAN WEATHER BUREAU AT 12 MIDNIGHT AST 0400Z AND A BULLETIN WILL BE ISSUED AT 9 PM AST.

SAN JUAN WEATHER BUREAU BULLETIN FOR PRESS RADIO AND TV 9 PM AST SEPTEMBER 24 1963.

HURRICANE WARNINGS ARE IN EFFECT FOR THE LEEWARD AND WINDWARD ISLANDS FROM GUADELOUPE TO ST VINCENT AND BARBADOS. GALE WARNINGS REMAIN IN EFFECT NORTH OF GUADELOUPE TO ST MAARTEN AND SOUTH OF ST VINCENT TO GRENADA.

HEAVY SEAS HAVE ALREADY BEEN REPORTED AT BARBADOS AND ST LUCIA AND WINDS IN GUSTS UP TO 50 MPH HAVE OCCURRED AT BARBADOS. PRECAUTIONS SHOULD BE RUSHED TO COMPLETION IN THE AREA OF HURRICANE WARNING. RADAR OBSERVATIONS FROM BARBADOS INDICATED THAT THE EYE OF HURRICANE EDITH WAS LOCATED ABOUT 30 MILES EAST NORTHEAST OF BARBADOS A SHORT TIME AGO. WITH A WEST NORTHWEST MOVEMENT AT A SPEED OF 18 MPH THE STORM WILL MOVE THROUGH THE ISLAND CHAIN AND INTO THE CARIBBEAN DURING THE NIGHT. REPEATING IMMEDIATE HURRICANE PRECAUTIONS SHOULD BE TAKEN IN THE AREA OF HURRICANE WARNING AGAINST HURRICANE FORCE WINDS TORRENTIAL RAINS HIGH TIDES AND HEAVY SURF.

HURRICANE EDITH OFFERS NO DANGER TONIGHT TO PUERTO RICO VIRGIN ISLANDS AREA. ITS PRESENT DIRECTION AND SPEED HOWEVER WOULD TAKE IT SOUTH OF PUERTO RICO DURING THE NIGHT TOMORROW AND IT IS PROBABLE THAT A HURRICANE WATCH WILL BE INITIATED FOR THESE AREAS LATER TONIGHT OR TOMORROW.

HIGHEST WINDS ARE NEAR 80 MPH NEAR THE CENTER OF THE STORM AND GALES EXTEND OUTWARD 200 MILES IN THE NORTH AND EAST QUADRANT AND 75 MILES IN THE SOUTH AND WEST QUADRANTS. SHIPPING IN THE PATH OF THE STORM SHOULD EXERCISE EXTREME CAUTION AND SMALL CRAFT IN THE LESSER ANTILLES SHOULD REMAIN IN PORT.

THE NEXT REGULAR ADVISORY WILL BE ISSUED AT 12 MIDNIGHT AST.

HURRICANE WARNINGS ARE IN EFFECT FOR THE LEEWARD ISLANDS AND WINDWARD ISLANDS FROM GUADELOUPE TO ST VINCENTS AND ARE DISCONTINUED FOR BARBADOS. GALE WARNINGS ARE CONTINUED NORTH OF GUADELOUPE TO ST MAARTEN AND SOUTH OF ST VINCENTS TO GRENADA AND ARE ALSO EFFECTIVE FOR BARBADOS. A HURRICANE WATCH IS INITIATED FOR PUERTO RICO AND THE VIRGIN ISLANDS.

ALL PEOPLE IN THE AREA OF HURRICANE WARNING SHOULD TAKE IMMEDIATE PRECAUTIONS TO SECURE LIFE AND PROPERTY FROM HURRICANE FORCE WINDS TORRENTIAL RAIN HIGH TIDES AND HEAVY SURF. WIND AND FLOOD DAMAGE HAS ALREADY BEEN REPORTED AT MARTINIQUE AND ST LUCIA. SINCE HURRICANE EDITH IS EXPECTED TO MOVE THROUGH THE ISLAND CHAIN AND INTO THE CARIBBEAN DURING THE NIGHT THERE IS NO LONGER TIME TO DELAY NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS.

ON THE BASIS OF RADAR AND ISLAND STATION REPORTS HURRICANE EDITH WAS ESTIMATED TO BE CENTERED AT MIDNIGHT AST...0400Z...NEAR LATITUDE 14.0N LONGITUDE 60.4W OR ABOUT 40 STATUTE MILES EAST OF ST LUCIA IN THE WINDWARD ISLANDS AND 500 STATUTE MILES SOUTHEAST OF SAN JUAN PUERTO RICO. IT IS MOVING TOWARD THE WEST NORTHWEST ABOUT 15 MPH AND IS EXPECTED TO MAINTAIN ITS PRESENT COURSE AND SPEED FOR THE NEXT 12 HOURS.

HIGHEST WINDS ARE ABOUT 80 MPH OVER A SMALL AREA NEAR THE CENTER AND GALE FORCE WINDS EXTEND OUTWARD 200 MILES IN THE NORTH AND EAST QUADRANTS AND 75 MILES IN THE SOUTH AND WEST QUADRANTS. LITTLE CHANGE IN SIZE AND INTENSITY IS EXPECTED DURING THE NEXT 12 HOURS.

THERE IS NO IMMEDIATE DANGER TO PUERTO RICO AND THE VIRGIN ISLANDS. AS A PRECAUTION HOWEVER A HURRICANE WATCH HAS BEEN INITIATED AND PEOPLE IN THIS AREA SHOULD KEEP IN TOUCH WITH LATEST ADVISORIES AND BULLETINS.

SHIPPING IN THE PATH OF HURRICANE EDITH SHOULD EXERCISE EXTREME CAUTION AND SMALL CRAFT IN THE LESSER ANTILLES SHOULD REMAIN IN PORT.

IT IS MOVING BETWEEN NORTHWEST AND NORTH-NORTHWEST ABOUT 10 MPH AND IS EXPECTED TO CONTINUE ON THIS COURSE AT THE SAME SPEED FOR THE NEXT 12 HOURS.

FROM THE RADAR AT RAMEY AIR FORCE BASE AND FROM THE SAN JUAN WEATHER BUREAU INDICATES THAT THE CENTER IS LOCATED AT 10 PM AST...0200Z...A SHORT DISTANCE SOUTHWEST OF MONA ISLAND OR ABOUT 130 STATUTE MILES WEST SOUTHWEST OF SAN JUAN PUERTO RICO. IT APPEARS TO BE MOVING BETWEEN NORTHWEST AND NORTH-NORTHWEST AND SHOULD PASS OVER CABO ENCANO DOMINICAN REPUBLIC AT DAYBREAK FRIDAY MORNING.

HURRICANE EDITH MADE AN ABRUPT TURN TO THE NORTH WEST THIS AFTERNOON AFTER FOLLOWING A COURSE TOWARD THE WEST NORTHWEST FOR THE LAST 4 DAYS. AT THE SAME TIME EDITH APPEARED TO WEAKEN WHILE MAKING THE RECURVE.

HURRICANE WARNINGS WERE ISSUED FOR THE EXTREME WESTERN PORTION THROUGH MONA PASSAGE. IT NOW APPEARS TO BE MOVING TOWARD THE NORTHWEST AT 10 MPH AND IS EXPECTED TO CONTINUE IN THIS DIRECTION AND AT THE SAME SPEED FOR THE NEXT 12 HOURS WITH INDICATIONS OF A RECURVE TOWARD THE NORTH AFTER THIS PERIOD. THE STORM HAS BEEN SLOW TO REGENERATE AND TO ASSUME A CONSISTENT MOVEMENT AFTER ITS PASSAGE OVER LAND. IT NOW APPEARS TO BE MOVING TOWARD THE NORTHWEST AT ABOUT 7 MPH.

HIGHEST WINDS ARE ESTIMATED 55 MPH IN A FEW SQUALLS NEAR THE CENTER WITH GALES EXTENDING OUTWARD 110 MILES IN THE NORTHEAST SEMICIRCLE AND 45 MILES TO THE SOUTHWEST.

THIS POSITION IS ABOUT 70 STATUTE MILES NORTHEAST OF MAYAGUANA IN THE BAHAMAS. THE CENTER HAS BECOME VERY DIFFUSED AND IS DIFFICULT TO LOCATE PRECISELY.
